LRP Registration Policies & Procedures

- Call or come in to book your time slot at one of our eight benches.
 - Reservations on the LRP must be scheduled at least one full business day before desired date (e.g. reservations for Tuesday must be booked by Sunday), but no more than 1 month in advance
 - Available every Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday to the public unless closed for a private event or maintenance
 - Minimum of two hour SET time slots per bench available non-negotiable start times:
 - 8am, 10am, 12pm, 2pm, 4pm (Summer)
 - 9am, 11pm, and 1pm (Winter)
 - \$20 (\$12 for annual pass holders) per bench, per time slot, per adult
 - Each shooter must have their own reservation
- Non-public days may be scheduled within two months of desired date and no less than 7 days in advance for \$250 or \$20/person whichever is greater
- Payment required at time of reservation
- 24 hour notice on all cancellations and no refund will be issued. "Rain Check" available for a later date if you cancel <u>outside</u> the 24 hour notice policy
- If we have bad weather, "Rain Delay" is in effect and you may book your time for another date

*All ranges are subject to closure due to permitted events or maintenance

GENERAL LRP RULES

*Failure to comply with LRP rules may result in termination of shooting privileges.

- Parking in designated areas only
- No food or drink (with the exception of water) on the shooting benches.
- Shooters must obey all commands given by RSO while at the firing line.
- For target engagements at or beyond 1,000 yards, you and your equipment must be reasonably capable of impacting steel targets at that distance.
- To shoot at or beyond 1,000 yards on the LRP YOU MUST BE ABLE TO:
- Show dope card, ballistics program or be able to verbally articulate the known ballistics of your cartridge.
- Alternately, be able to demonstrate consistent proficiency at 1000 yards.
- No random or unreasonable elevation adjustments "in hopes of hitting a target."
- Be neighborly when two or more shooters are engaging the same steel target (take turns)
- If wildlife is killed, injured or fired upon, all applicable wildlife laws will be enforced
- No assembling, preparing, working on or repairing of guns or ammunition on the picnic tables
- No uncased firearms are allowed to be placed on or leaned against the picnic tables
- When your time is up, please clean up, police your brass & clear your bench promptly.
- No tracer/incendiary or AP/ penetrator (green tip) rounds allowed at CSEC.
- Use of the .50 BMG cartridge is not permitted on the LRP at any time.

SAFETY RULES

- Eye and Ear protection required for all shooters and spectators (available at CSEC office)
- Pointing or allowing a firearm (whether loaded or not) to be pointed at or near another person will result in immediate termination of shooting privileges for the day. This includes owners of un-attended firearms placed horizontally anywhere other than on the firing line which someone walks in front of

THIS IS A ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

- No going forward of muzzles at any time while the range is hot for any reason. This includes retrieving gear or picking up brass. Anyone going down-range of muzzles on the firing line while the line is hot will be required to put away their gear and stop shooting for the day and either leave or remain behind the firing line
- Any accidental or negligent discharge will disqualify the shooter for the remainder of the day
- During a Cease-Fire condition all bolts must be clearly and visibly open and for auto loaders, chamber flags must be inserted (Chamber flags are available at the CSEC Office)
- Persons who have repeat safety violations may be banned permanently from handling firearms and/or participating in other activities at CSEC
- If an unsafe condition is observed, everyone is responsible to take action and loudly declare a cease-fire. The RSO will take charge and evaluate the safety issue until it is adequately resolved.
- All firearms must arrive at the firing line empty with the bolt/action open
- Auto loaders must have chamber flags at any time that they are not on the bench
- All uncased firearms must be carried with muzzles straight up and actions open
- Uncased firearms are allowed to be horizontal on the firing line only
- No loaded firearms anywhere other than on the firing line and only when the line is hot
- All shooting must be done from the marked firing line (except as authorized during permitted events)

THE FOUR BASIC RULES OF FIREARM SAFETY

- 1. Always treat EVERY firearm as if it is loaded
- 2. NEVER point a firearm at anything you are not willing to destroy
- 3. Keep your finger off the trigger until your sights are on your target
- 4. Know your target and what is beyond
